COURSE SUPERINTENDENT NOTE

I feel like we are in the same situation as when I wrote last month's newsletter. We are dealing with the same conditions. We may have a better handle on the clippings, but the stubborn wet spots are still wet. Just when things start to get close to drying up, we get another major rain event. Since July first we have received 540mm of rain and counting as I write this. We have changed priorities this fall from building some tee decks to installing drainage and extending some cart paths.

The following are some highlights of the recent work we have completed:

- We removed the sod from a portion of 18 tee, levelled the tee and reinstalled the sod.
- We used our big fairway slicer to aerate the wet fairway spots to help move water through the
- profile.
- We aerated greens with a small pencil sized solid tine.
- We did some more tree pruning.
- We have started edging bunkers as well.

Much of the work this month has been cleaning up after the rain events. We are hoping that this rain stops, and we have a more enjoyable fall.

Please take care and follow the signage and stay out of the wet areas that are pegged off.

I wanted to take a second to let you know about the Robinson Cup Matches that are being held at Osprey Ridge and CGC on Sept 30th & Oct 1st. The Robinson Cup is an annual competition between Osprey, Bluenose GC and Chester and this year is its 25th year. Captain Mike Richardson has put together an all star squad that is destined to bring the Cup back where it belongs. It would be great to have you come out on the 1st to cheer on the lads!

One common theme on the range is to aim too far to the right and swing over the top which leads to a loss of power and can cause a big slice. Practicing with an alignment aid is one of the easiest ways to train your aim and reduce your chances of coming over the top. To do this, place an alignment stick in line with your target, just outside of your ball position. When you get over the ball, make sure your feet, knees and hips are square to the alignment rod.

If you're someone that needs to look at the target before you pull the trigger, swivel your head, not your entire upper body. Players that aim too far right have a tendency to move their entire upper torso when peaking at the target.

Or you can do what legendary instructor Harvey Penick says to do and Take Dead Aim!


